Red squirrel

Red squirrels are sometimes seen at Carphin, usually on higher parts of the estate, in coniferous woodland. With the arrival of squirrel pox in Fife, which is carried by grey squirrels but is lethal to red squirrels, the Fife populations of reds are vulnerable, given the presence of many grey squirrels.
