Common especially in farmland, but usually less common than the green-veined white.

A very common species.






Small copper

Fairly widely distributed in Fife. This one was at Bankhead Moss in September.





Red admiral

A common species especially in late summer.



Small tortoiseshell

A common and familiar species.



Peacock

The peacock has spread north in recent years and is now one of the most common butterflies in Fife.





Comma

A distinctive species that has spread northwards into Fife. This one was at Bankhead Moss in late September 2018.





Ringlet

Common in grassland.
