Hemlock moth Agonopterix alstromeriana

An uncommon species in Fife, occurring mostly at or near the coast. This one was at Magus Muir in mid-March 2024.



Common brindled brown *Agonopterix heracliana*

A very common species that often winters in garages and garden sheds.





Red-eyed buff Agonopterix ocellana

A common species in areas where willows grow.





Early reveller Diurnea fagella

A common spring species of deciduous woodland.





Purple spring jewel / large spring jewel Eriocrania sangii / Eriocrania semipurpurella

Two spring species of birch woodland that cannot be separated from images.
